Constitutional changes

Due to the unprecedented circumstances we found ourselves in last year being in strict 'lockdown' for 3 months then restricted numbers for face to face meetings, the NFWI has sent out consultation documents to amend the constitution. This is to allow for virtual meetings and votes to be taken by members and trustees without being physically present and to cancel/postpone annual meetings for safety reasons. Whilst emergency legislation allowed WIs to use these types of meetings, ourselves included, for a limited time, these amendments need to be formally adopted for the future. At our January meeting we will be asking members for an anonymous vote to amend the constitution at both individual WI level and federation level.
